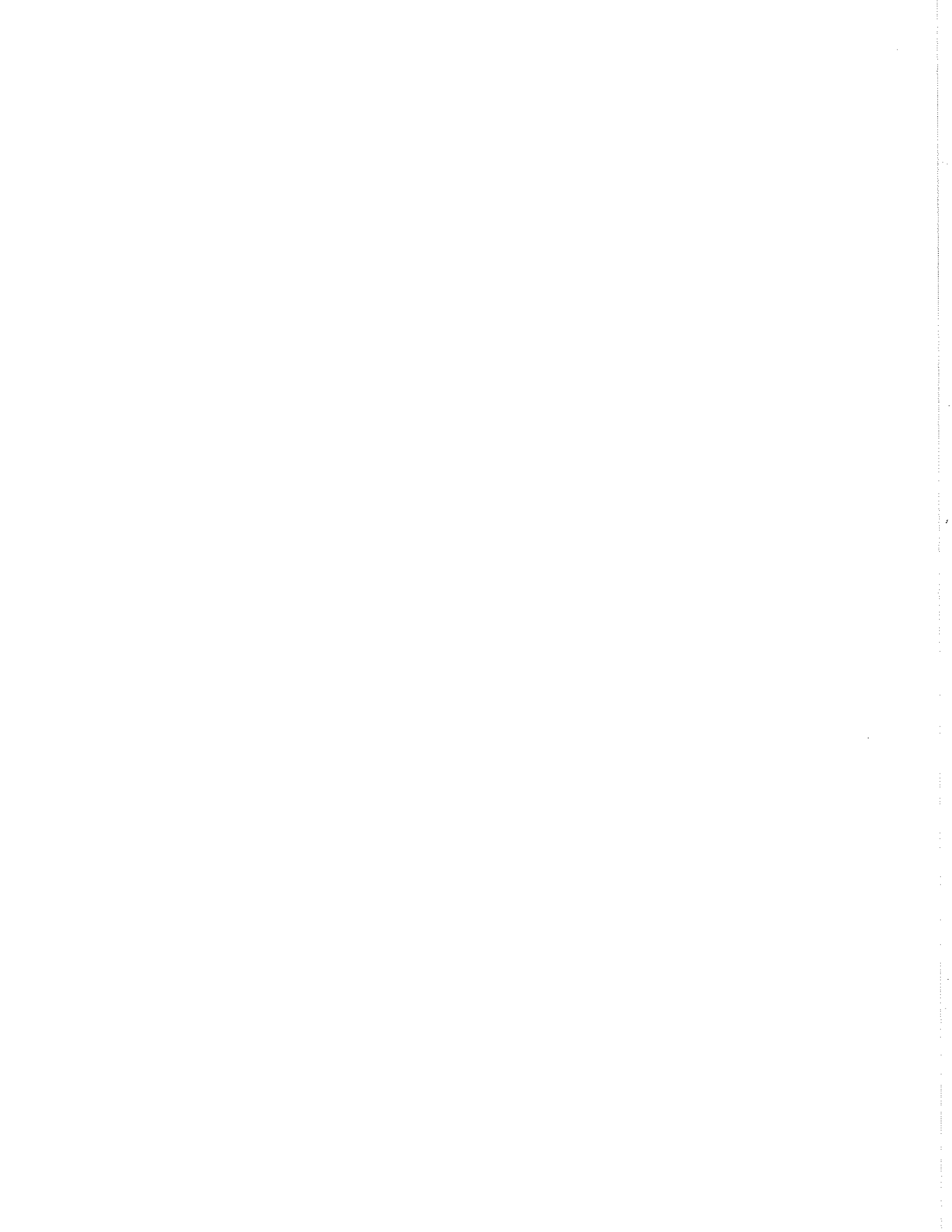


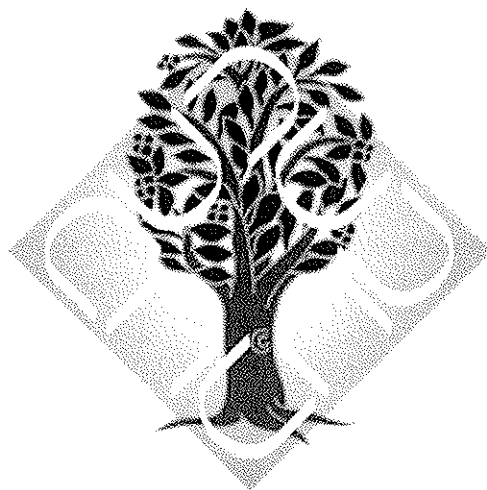

## Opening Remarks of the Vice Chancellor

At the outset, the Vice Chancellor extended a warm welcome to all the Members of the Academic Council to its 25<sup>th</sup> meeting.

The Vice Chancellor briefed the members about the following activities held during the intervening period.

1. The Vice Chancellor informed the members about the Court Meeting held online on 09.12.2021 and conveyed the appreciation of the Hon'ble Chancellor on the efforts made by the University by way of various initiatives undertaken including introduction of six new programmes, implementation of the New Education Policy and monitoring of the new Campus projects. The Vice Chancellor also conveyed the compliments from the Hon'ble Chancellor on the role played by management, faculty and students for the smooth conduct of the University along with the achievement of its goals and completing the programs timely during the unprecedented Covid-19 crisis.
2. The Vice Chancellor informed and invited the members to the 10<sup>th</sup> Convocation of the University scheduled to be held on 21.12.2021. It was informed that Dr. Dr. Krishnaswamy Kasturirangan former scientist and Head, ISRO and currently Chancellor of Central University of Rajasthan will deliver the convocation address. The Hon'ble Lt Governor of Delhi, Shri.Anil Baijal, in his capacity as the Chancellor of the University will preside over the Convocation ceremony. Shri Manish Sisodia, Deputy Chief Minister, Delhi and Education Minister will be the Chief Guest and Secretary, Higher Education shall be the Special Guest in the Convocation Ceremony.
3. The Vice Chancellor informed the members about the observations made by the Court members regarding increase in the Research Output in the form of Research Papers which will improve the University rating and quality of teaching learning.
4. The Vice Chancellor also informed all the members about the first rank secured by the University in the Swachhata Ranking 2020 in the category of Educational Institutions.

The Academic Council in its 25<sup>th</sup> meeting deliberated on the agendas placed before it and passed the following **resolutions**:

### **Agenda 25.1 : Confirmation of the Minutes of the 24<sup>th</sup> Meeting of the Academic Council held on 17.09.2021**

The minutes of the 24<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Academic Council held on 17.09.2021, were circulated among all the members vide email dated 12.11.2021.

No comments were received from any of the members.

**Agenda 25.2 : Action Taken Report (ATR) on the decisions taken in the 24<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Academic Council.**

Action Taken Report on the decisions taken in the 24<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Academic Council held on 17.09.2021 was placed before the Academic Council vide (**Appendix-1**).

**Decision:** The Academic Council noted the Action Taken Report and recommended to delete the recommendations pertaining to the change of the nomenclature 'supernumerary' in respect of foreign students admissions from the Resolution No.24.3.1 as minuted in the 24<sup>th</sup> Academic Council held on 17.09.2021 as these are supernumerary seats as per the statutory provision.

**Agenda 25.3 : To consider the conferment of degrees/ diplomas to the students in the 10<sup>th</sup> Annual Convocation to be held on 21.12.2021**

It was submitted to the Academic Council that the 10<sup>th</sup> Annual Convocation of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University Delhi for conferment of degrees/ diplomas to the students who had successfully completed all the assessment requirements of courses in the year 2021 is scheduled to be held on Tuesday, December 21, 2021 at AUD Kashmere Gate Campus, Lothian Road, Delhi.

It was informed that Dr. Krishnaswamy Kasturirangan former scientist and Head, ISRO and currently Chancellor of Central University of Rajasthan will deliver the convocation address. The Hon'ble Lt Governor of Delhi, Shri Anil Baijal, in his capacity as the Chancellor of the University will preside over the Convocation ceremony. Shri Manish Sisodia, Deputy Chief Minister, Delhi and Education Minister will be the Chief Guest and Secretary, Higher Education shall be the Special Guest in the Convocation Ceremony.

It was further informed that a total of **1040** students who completed the prescribed requirements during the academic year 2020-21 will be awarded with PhD, MPhil, MBA, MA, BA (Hons) Degrees in various fields of studies. **Decision:** In exercise of the powers conferred under the University Act 24 (1) sub clause (xii), the Academic Council resolved to approve the conferment of degrees/ diplomas to the students who had successfully completed all the assessment requirements of courses in the year 2021 in the 10<sup>th</sup> Annual Convocation held on 21.12.2021. The Academic Council further authorized the Vice Chancellor to approve and allow any additional case for conferment of degrees/diplomas in the forthcoming convocation.

**Agenda 25.4 : To note the recommendations of the Committee constituted to work out the guidelines for the availing AUD Merit Research Scholarship Scheme (AUDMRFS)**

The Academic Council noted that that the Research and Consultancy (R&C) Division of the University had submitted that the Board of Management in its 27<sup>th</sup> meeting held on 30.09.2019 had resolved to approve a fellowship scheme “**Ambedkar University Research Fellowship Scheme (AURFS)**” for 100 research scholars pursuing Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) programmes of the University.

The Academic Council further noted that the Vice Chancellor had set up a committee which was notified by the University vide Notification No. AUD/Registrar/2021-22/Misc./15 dated 07.05.2021, for framing the detailed guidelines to be followed for administering the AURFS for the fellowship scheme

The Academic Council noted that the Vice Chancellor has considered and approved the proposed regulations/guidelines (**Appendix-3**) for availing the Ambedkar University Delhi Merit Research Fellowship Scheme (AUDFRMS) (re-christened name) by the PhD research scholars of the University, on the basis of the recommendations of the aforesaid Committee.

**Decision:** The Academic Council noted the above information.

**Agenda 25.5 : To note the extension of the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) signed by Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University Delhi (India) and the Ludwigsburg University of Education (Germany)**

The Academic Council noted that the Dean (IAD) has submitted that Dr.B.R.Ambedkar University Delhi (AUD) and Ludwigsburg University of Education (LUE) had signed a MoU on cultural, educational and research cooperation in all fields of academic endeavour to promote cooperation between India and Germany. The MoU was signed on August 30, 2017 by the Registrar, Dr.B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi and the Rector of LUE which had a validity period of four years from the effective date.

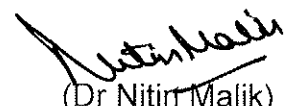
The Academic Council noted that there is a clause pertaining to the automatic renewal mentioned in the MoU. In accordance with the said clause, the Council observed that the MoU has been further extended for a period of four years from the effective date and he same was signed by the Registrar, Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University and the Rector, LUE on November 10, 2021.

The Academic Council further noted that the MoU will be renewed automatically unless one party declares its wish to terminate the MoU at least six months prior to the envisaged termination date. A copy of the renewed MoU is placed at **Appendix-4**.

**Decision: The Academic Council noted the above information and recommended to send a copy of the said MoU to the Directorate of Higher Education, Govt. of NCT of Delhi and UGC for information.**

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to all the members.

As deliberated, a total of 1098 applications were received from foreign students for admission to UG, PG and Ph.D. courses for admission during the Academic Year 2021-22, via the portal of Indian Council of Cultural Relations. The last date for screening the applications and submitting the selected ones on the portal was 30.06.2021.</p> <p>As per guidelines laid down by the ICCR, the Council has linked all the Universities of repute on A2A Portal so that the applications of foreign applicants applying through ICCR lands directly to the university selected by the applicant. In the process, universities will be able to scrutinize the application and decide on the eligibility criteria on A2A portal itself. If found eligible for admission, the university can upload the offer of provisional admission letter mentioning the documentation required by student to get confirmed admission and other specific norms and condition of the university at the time of their reporting to University. University must ensure that subject offered by university to student along with date of reporting of student at university should be specified. In case of rejection, the university can select No to reject the application."</p> <p>In view of provisions laid down by the ICCR, it was decided to modify the policy of Ph.D. supervision to permit the addition of supernumerary seats to the number of Ph.D. students that can be supervised by each eligible faculty as per Clause 6.5 of the UGC regulations, 2016. The Committee further deliberated on the fact that since, the admission cycle for the academic year 2021 -22 will begin later this year, and the programme wise number of seats for Foreign Students has to be notified for the same, the admission cycle for the academic year 2020-21, which is under process will not be affected by the prospective admission of the Foreign Students in the 2021-22 cycle.</p>	<p>Recorded.</p> <p>The nomenclature "Supernumerary" refers to Foreign Students as a specific category of applicants in the admission process as defined by Govt. of India.</p>

Students will be exposed to the theoretical and field study to understand the implementation of public policies in the pursuit of distributive justice, in a welfare state like India. After analysing how public policies are conceptualised, formulated, and implemented, this course would focus on how public policies in India are working in social sector reforms.</p> <p><b>ii. Human Resource Management (4 Credits)</b></p> <p>This is a comprehensive course to understand how to manage people in organizations. The course is designed to acquaint the general management student with the core processes of the human resource function which are talent acquisition, development, performance management, reward and compensation cycle.</p> <p><b>iii. Financial Management (4 Credits)</b></p> <p>This course is foundational in nature as the different modules discussed in this course would subsequently be offered as full-fledged electives in the semesters to follow. It is essential for having a good grounding in finance and helps to enable the participants to make optimal utilization of firms' financial resources. It will begin with the need to understand the differentiation between sex and gender, analyses how gender is constructed and lived up through families and other social institutions. It then studies the concept of entrepreneurship and the marginalities of women and third gender people in both developing and developed nations. It seeks to understand the institutional barriers and glass ceiling effects in entrepreneurship. Through case studies and global examples, students will learn about policy initiatives and civil society intervention. This course will conclude about strategies needed to close this gender gap which would pave way for promoting gender empowerment.</p> <p>The Committee on SVPVCE further recommended the following:-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- A question was raised regarding the rationale for the inclusion of Spanish language in the programme. **Guidelines for availing  
AUD Merit Research Fellowship Scheme (AUDMRFS)**

**1. Objective:**

The AUD Merit Research Fellowship Scheme hereafter referred to as AUDMRF scheme, has been initiated by the AUD to attract meritorious research scholars and facilitate quality research to research scholars to pursue PhD in various disciplines in AUD.

**2. Fellowship & Tenure:**

- (a) This scheme shall be implemented from 2020-21 batch onwards for the scholars who are not availing any National scholarship like as UGC-JRF/CSIR-JRF/DBT-JRF or equivalent as specified by UGC.
- (b) The scheme excludes those scholars who are in employment.
- (c) The scholar availing AUDMRFS shall be given the fellowship at the same rates as that equivalent to UGC-JRF/SRF and as applicable from time to time.
- (d) The tenure of the scheme is for 5 years. For the first two years scholar availing AUDMRFS will get a fellowship at the same rate that is equivalent to UGC-JRF. After 2 years the student may apply for upgradation to a fellowship at the same rate that is equivalent to UGC-SRF after undergoing the same procedure as prescribed by UGC for upgradation from JRF to SRF and as applicable from time to time.

**3. Eligibility Criteria and Procedure:**

- (a) Programme-wise merit lists prepared for admission will serve as the merit list for award of Fellowship. From the admitted students, the person highest in the admission merit list and not in the excluded categories in item 2-(a) and 2- (b) will be awarded the fellowship
- (b) In the event that two students have the same highest position in the merit list in the programme and are eligible for AUDMRFS, then in case of availability of scholarship both will be awarded AUDMRFS. In case there is a limitation in terms of the numbers, then the person who is older in age will be awarded the fellowship
- (c) In PhD Programs that admit more than 5 scholars, AUDMRFS may be awarded to the top two scholars in the merit list as described in item 3-(a) provided that Clause 3-(b) does not apply.

#### 4. General Conditions:

- (a) PhD scholars who de-register will not be eligible for AUDMRFS during the de-registered period.
- (b) If, as a special case, a scholar remains on leave due to maternity/ medical/ extraordinary circumstances (not exceeding six months) with due approval by the Competent Authority (SCR/AC), the tenure of fellowship shall be deferred by that period. For this purpose, the UGC-JRF/SRF rules will be followed as applicable from time.
- (c) Regular monitoring of AUDMRFS will be done by the office designated for this purpose by competent authority. The process will consist of a Six-Monthly Progress Report in the prescribed format to be submitted by the scholar and duly forwarded by the supervisor and counter-signed by Dean of the concerned school.
- (d) The approval of the Fellowship for the subsequent semester shall be subject to the receipt of a satisfactory Six-Monthly Progress Report.
- (e) The fellowship may be discontinued /terminated if scholar is unable to complete the course work in first attempt and his/her research progress is found unsatisfactory. In such cases the student may then be given the normal AUD stipend (given to students who do not hold non-UGC JRF/SRF or equivalent).
- (f) Newly admitted research scholars should preferably avail the fellowship w.e.f. the academic session in which they are admitted to the PhD programme subject to the fulfilment of other specified terms and conditions of AUDMRFS.
- (g) Notwithstanding anything contained in these guidelines, for any unforeseen issues arising not covered under these guidelines, or in the event of differences of interpretation, the Vice Chancellor is authorized to take a decision in consultation with the School Dean and Dean (Student Services). The decision of the Vice Chancellor shall be final.

**Memorandum of Understanding (MoU)**  
between  
**Ambedkar University Delhi (India)**  
and  
**Ludwigsburg University of Education (Germany)**

**Preamble**

In accordance with a mutual desire to promote further cooperation between India and Germany, the Ambedkar University Delhi (AUD) and Ludwigsburg University of Education (LUE) join in the following MoU on cultural, educational and research cooperation in all fields of academic endeavor.

**Art. 1 Aims of the cooperation**

This Memorandum shall promote exchange between both parties in the following areas:

- Joint research and educational activities (with a special focus on ethnic and social diversity and intercultural learning in the Indian and German education system),
- Exchange of invitations to scholars for lectures, visits and sharing experiences,
- Exchange of invitation to scholars for participation in conferences, symposia and seminars,
- Exchange of scientific personnel for the purpose of joint research,
- Exchange of administrative personnel for the purpose of training and sharing best practices,
- Exchange of students (1<sup>st</sup> to 3<sup>rd</sup> cycle, 1-2 semesters).

**Art. 2 Student Exchange**

Student exchange (semester exchange) will be organized in the following way:

- Students from the sending university can spend up to two semesters at the host university but will not be allowed to earn a degree from the host university.
- They shall be selected in a fair and transparent selection mode with the specific selection criteria (e.g., academic merit and foreign language competency) being published in advance.
- Each party nominates its students to the other party within the agreed deadlines. The final decision lies with the receiving institution.
- Students shall pay any tuition fees to their home university and will be exempted from tuition fees at the host university. A registration or administrative fees (e.g., at LUE currently 130 € per semester) can be charged by the host university but students have to be informed in advance. All other expenses (e.g., health insurance, travel expenses) shall be borne by the individual student.
- Both parties agree to exchange students based on the signature of a prior learning agreement and to recognize any credits that have been earned as part of this learning agreement.
- The availability of scholarships depends upon project funding.

**Art. 3 Exchange of Personnel**

Exchange of personnel will be organized in the following way:





- Each university nominates its staff members prior to the exchange to the other party. The final decision lies with the receiving institution.
- Each party makes sure that the target groups at the various faculties and departments of the sending institutions will be informed about possibilities of exchange (publication on the website/intranet, group mails, etc.)
- The receiving institution does not have any financial obligations with regard to receiving invited personnel. Each institution will cover the costs for sending personnel to the other party (if not specified otherwise by project funding).

#### Art. 4 Specific arrangements for project management

In February 2017, LUE and AUD successfully applied for a joint project funded by the Baden-Wuerttemberg Foundation within the Programme BWS+. Both parties agreed to jointly implement this project with the title "Schools of Education as Agents of Change. Coping with Diversity in the Digital Age" during the project duration (1<sup>st</sup> of September 2017- 31<sup>st</sup> of August 2022).

LUE will contribute in the following way:

- General project management as the grant holder,
- Organisation of joint (online) courses in cooperation with colleagues from AUD,
- Organisation of a summer school in Ludwigsburg. Travel expenses, room and a small living allowance will be provided to all Indian participants.
- Organisation of a kick-off meeting and a final conference in Ludwigsburg.
- Responsibility for managing the finances of the project. Payments to project participants according to the project shall be made by LUE, i.e., Indian participants will receive any travel or living allowances by cheque upon arrival in Germany.

AUD will contribute in the following way:

- Sends lecturers to LUE for a kick-off meeting and for a final conference
- Allows its lecturers to contribute to the project's aim of establishing joint (online) courses with individual sessions from Indian colleagues being integrated in courses provided by LUE colleagues
- Nomination of lecturers and students who participate in a summer school in Ludwigsburg
- Organisation of a summer school at Ambedkar University Delhi. Summer school participants will receive financial support directly from LUE for travel expenses, room and board. AUD makes sure that the necessary infrastructure will be provided and allows its lecturers to contribute to the organization and to contribute to it.

**Art. 4 Financial arrangements**


Both parties agree that all financial arrangements necessary to implement this agreement must be negotiated and will depend upon the availability of funds.

**Art. 5 Duration of the Memorandum**

This MoU will become effective upon the date of signature by the representatives of the Universities and approval by appropriate authorities.

This MoU which was earlier signed on 30<sup>th</sup> August 2017 is further extended valid for a period of four years from the effective date and will be renewed automatically unless one party declares its wish to terminate the MoU at least six months prior to the envisaged termination date. In the case of termination, all started activities have to be finished by both parties in order to guarantee reliability to all participants involved in the exchange.
