




Subject: Revised budget for the project titled "Poetry in the Indo-Islamic Millennium: from Manuscript to Teaching Tools"- regarding



Duration of Project – 6 months

Developing content for the AUD Digital Repository, in the form of various kinds of archives, viz. community knowledge, social history and literary, ethnographic and institutional memory is an important part of CCK themes and activities. CCK is in discussion with donors of rare and historical community based ethnographic material in the form of photographs, multimedia and textual material from the following privately held sources. Besides adding to the body of knowledge and information available in public sphere, the above four archives are of sufficient scholarly and public interest to draw attention and web traffic to the AUD website.

The current project involves work on digitising and cataloguing two rare and historical collections.

1. Digitising of Amrit Lal Nagar Archive - personal records, field notes and ephemera –

In addition to being a prolific writer, Amritlal Nagar was a versatile scholar. Unpublished research notes and papers, photographs and audio visual recordings of this eminent Hindi writer of the mid 20th century. The digitisation and creating of public access to the Amritlal Nagar Archive will add enormously to the public knowledge of the social and literary life in Northern India during the mid five decades of the twentieth century, (approximately 1930 to 1980).

Today Amritlal Nagar's Research Library consists of approximately 3500 magazines dating back from 1902 and a collection of over 20,000 books—many of which are rare and out of print. Funds are sought for the general maintenance and preservation of the current holdings of Amritlal Nagar reference Library and for undertaking an extensive digitization project of rare and irreplaceable materials in Amritlal Nagar Archives. The digital archives of Amritlal Nagar's manuscripts, photographs, field and research notes, and audio recordings will be hosted by Ambedkar University Delhi.

Many of the artefacts such as semi precious stone encrusted daggers and inlaid crockery were brought by the family's ancestors when they came to India from Iran. The family ruled a small principality in northern India before they were



defeated by Akbar and subsequently engaged in his army. They moved to Delhi with ShahJahan and their personal collection boasts of some extraordinary objects. They are presently preserved with the Changhezis in a small room dedicated to these objects in cellophane laminations and paper wraps.

The cataloguing and digitising to create a digital online catalogue of the entire collection involves interviewing the collectors, listing and accessing the collection, and determining provenance of the objects in the collection.

It is proposed that AUD undertake the cataloguing and itemising of these objects in agreement with the Hazrat Shah Waliullah Library (which they run) and the Changhezi family.

Work Plan: (to begin from January 2015)

1. Hire of Project Assistant (Archiving)
2. Identification and cataloguing of the Changezi collection – objects, images and texts.
3. Initiate the digitising process in Lucknow by initiating instalment of the outsourcing costs.
4. Preparing a publication on the two collections, which include context and narratives.
5. Making visible the catalogue and highlights in an online archive.

Sub: Proposal to create a Social Science & Humanities Research Archive (SSHRA) of literary, social and historical documents.

CCK and SLS would like to partner in creating a Social Science and Humanities Research Archive (SSHRA) to facilitate sharing of historical field data and primary research collected by researchers across disciplines, both external and from within AUD, who wish other researchers to access this material.

CCK has been approached by a number of eminent literary and scholarly persons or their heirs and successors, to digitise and digitally archive their writings, notes, photographs and audio visual recordings, and make these publicly accessible. Such a collection of historical research data from the early decades of the twentieth century if made available easily to social science researchers, will add enormously to the public knowledge of social, economic and literary life of those times.

The archive and its collections would cover a range of subjects, and serve as a 'special collections' library. Accessed and catalogued data would be made searchable using an online catalogue which may be part of the AUD library system. As a professionally managed digital repository SSRA would serve researchers in humanities and social sciences belonging to three constituencies: AUD faculty members and research staff, research (viz. MPhil and PhD) scholars of the University, and researchers at large accessing the collection online.

SSHRA would raise funds for its digitisation and archiving projects on a case by case basis from within and outside AUD. While most collections will be sourced and funded externally, projects proposed by AUD faculty will also be considered for internal (AUD research project) funding.

The second iteration of this festival aims to take the interest that was visible in April 2015 in ways that combine the popular public awareness and entertainment events with scholarly discussions that will give directions for taking this annual festival further.

With this in mind, three specific sections have been planned,





Centre for Urban Ecology and Sustainability [CUES] and Restoration of Dheerpur Wetlands

The university has entered into an MoU with the DDA (dated 17.2.2015, Annexure I) wherein an area of 25.38 Ha of land at Dheerpur that belongs to DDA has been provided to AUD for restoration of wetlands in the interest of conservation of biodiversity and regeneration of hydrological functions in the area. This MoU has been signed considering the in-house expertise at AUD (SHE), and that the University campus would be in the immediate neighbourhood to carry out long-term research, monitoring and maintenance of the wetlands. This part of the implementation of the decision was taken by the Hon'ble LG *vide* a meeting held on 12.3.2012 under his Chairmanship with members of DDA and the University.

With a view to create a Centre with a mandate on Urban Ecology, Conservation of Wetlands and Urban Sustainability, that will also hold the primary responsibility for restoring the Wetlands at Dheerpur, the Vice Chancellor has constituted an Interim Committee (Annexure II, Notification) till a formal management structure both for the Centre and for the Dheerpur Restoration Project is in place.

Considering the scope of work and urgency of the matter, a meeting was called by VC (Dated 27.3.2015), of the IC with the CMT to discuss the preparation and progress on various aspects of the Centre and the project. It was decided during this meeting that the Centre would be called as '**Centre for Urban Ecology and Sustainability**' (CUES) and that it needs to develop processes and documentation for various objectives on an urgent basis. Specifically, a pre-proposal for development of wetlands for funding by DDA, and a vision document of CUES need to be urgently developed. It was also decided that a Research Assistant be hired on an urgent basis for this purpose (Item No.2, Annexure III).

Following the decision taken at the meeting, a candidate for the post of Research Assistant, specialised research experience in ecology and wildlife biology, with a basic understanding of research projects and restoration ecology has been identified to help with preparation of baseline data, documentation and proposal writing.

In this regard, it is requested that the following may be approved:

1. Mr. Ajay Immanuel Gonji, be appointed as Research Assistant (salary @ Rs.18,000 p.m., consolidated) for a period of six months with effect from 1.4.2015 for immediate implementation of the project (Annexure IV: CV, application details).
2. Proposal for a start-up grant for CUES with budgetary justifications (Annexure V) as enclosed.

Proposal for Start-up Grant for Centre for Urban Ecology and Sustainability (CUES)

The University envisages creating a Centre for Urban Ecology and Sustainability (CUES) particularly to address research in the areas of Urban Ecology, Ecological Restoration and Urban Sustainability. In a recent meeting of the Interim Committee (IC) of CUES with the Core Management Team (CMT), it was suggested that a small core team be constituted to initiate the preparatory steps of the Centre and initiate research activities with particular emphasis on its first major project - restoration of wetlands at Dheerpur (Annexure VI). A detailed proposal with the vision and plan of the Centre would be generated with the help of this team. This team will also help create the proposal for the restoration of Dheerpur Wetlands in immediate pursuance of our MoU with DDA. It is expected that the basic Human Resource and assets being sought in this proposal will form the nucleus to initiate the functioning of the Centre. The start-up grant is being sought for a period of six months.


