Subject: Recommendations of the Advisory Committee on Research and Project Management (ACRPM) held on 11.09.2017 – reg.

A Meeting of the Advisory Committee on Research and Project Management (ACRPM) was held on 11.09.2017. A copy of the signed minutes of the meeting is at F/A. The minutes have been circulated among the members via email dated 13.10.2017. The ACRPM considered and recommended the following:

1. The SOL's proposals were referred back to the Dean, SOL for revision with the following observations:
 - a) **Database of Hindi resources in Social Sciences and Humanities**
 - i. In the budget line item, the category 'student member' needs to be replaced with Research Assistant.
 - ii. The contingency expenditure of Rs. 50,000/- needs to be disaggregated and divided into sub-heads.
 - b) **Translating Theory**
 - i. The role of the Research Assistant is not clear.
 - ii. Contingency of Rs. 204675 needs to be disaggregated and divided into sub-heads.
 - iii. This projects looks to be focused on translating key texts in the social sciences. Hence Dean, SOL is requested to identify the key texts and the lead translators.
 - iv. The Honorarium for commissioned translations of Rs. 1 lakh looks to be too low.
 - v. The role of secretarial help needs to be specified clearly.
2. The ACRPM considered and recommended the **CCK-CDP project proposal titled "The River and the City -Multiple Narratives of the Jamuna in Delhi"** for further approval by suggesting to follow the AUD norms while recruiting Research Assistants.
3. The ACRPM considered the proposal titled "**Early Literacy Initiative**" with TISS (proposed by CECED) and recommended the signing of the MoU through the Registrar's Office. The project will be supported by the Tata Trusts.
4. The ACRPM considered the project titled "**Poetry in the Indo-Islamic Millennium: From Manuscript to Teaching Tools**" submitted by Dr. Shad Naved, Principal Investigator, Dr. Mrityunjay Tripathi (Co-Principal Investigator-1) and Dr. Awadhesh Tripathi (Co-Principal Investigator-1) for financial support of Rs. 6,45,000/- from AUD and recommended for further approval.
5. The ACRPM considered the request of Dr. Santosh Singh and recommended for his project extension up to March 31, 2018 (in lieu of June 2018). (Project titled the "**Ravidassia Movement in Punjab: A sociological Study**")
6. It was recommended that information related to SMG to be disseminated from Dean (AS) with a follow up intimation from Chair ACRPM. A three member committee including Rukmini Sen, Yogesh Snehi and Babu P. Remesh was constituted to facilitate the implementation of the scheme, with the help of ACRPM secretariat, in a time bound manner.
7. While considering the request submitted by Dr. Nandini Nayak for use of available funds in other heads for meeting expenses of photocopying etc. for her project, it was decided that in future, such re-appropriation of funds across

line items is not to be allowed. Regarding selection of research recruitment needs to be done following existing AUD norms.

8. The ACRPM recommended the research proposal received from the School Development Studies titled "Researching Delhi – Mapping Industrial Production Work, Livelihoods and Capabilities in Delhi" for further approval.
9. On the BOM resolution No. 10.2 approved on 03.11.2016 related to expert panel for the selection committee, it was recommended that information will be sought from all Schools/Centres for preparing a consolidated panel. Dr. Sunita Tyagi to send a mail to all Schools/Centres.
10. It was recommended that ACRPM can either hire a Research Assistant or engage a PhD scholar (under the earn while you learn scheme). For the said purpose, total budget of Rs. 1.5. lakh (for 6 months) may be sought from the University.

In view of the above, it is proposed that the PVC-2 may kindly approve the above recommendations of the ACRPM.

The Meeting of the Advisory Committee on Research and Project Management (ACRPM) was held on 11 September 2017. The following were present:

Items on the Agenda:

1. **Confirmation of Minutes of the ACRPM Meeting held on 11.08.2017**

The minutes of the last meeting as circulated, were read and confirmed.

2. **To discuss the following collaborative projects, proposed by the Dean, SOL:**
 - a) **Database of Hindi resources in Social Sciences and Humanities**

While discussing this agenda, the need for preparing a database of Hindi resources in Social Sciences and Humanities was discussed. The ACRPM was of the view that the proposal of SOL to prepare this database is beneficial for the university. The ACRPM, while appreciating the proposal suggested that the proposal can be resubmitted to the next ACRPM meeting with the following revisions:

- i. In the budget line item, the category 'student member' needs to be replaced with Research Assistant.
- ii. The contingency expenditure of Rs.50000 needs to be broken up into sub-head.

- b) **Translating Theory**

The ACRPM discussed the proposal in detailed and pointed out the following:

- i. The role of Research Assistant is not clear.
- ii. Contingency of Rs. 204675 needs to be sub-divided.

- iii. This projects looks to be focused on translating key texts in the social sciences. Hence suggested to identify the text and the translators.
- iv. The Honorarium for commissioned translations of Rs. 1 lakh looks to be reasonable.
- v. The role of secretarial help needs to be specified clearly.

In view of the above, the proposal was referred back to the SOL for revision.

3. To discuss the revised CCK-CDP project proposal titled "The River and the City: Multiple narratives of the Jamuna in Delhi" received from the CCK for financial support from AUD.

The ACRPM took note of the revised CCK-CDP proposal and recommended for further approval with the suggestion that the names of the core-team members cannot be included in the project proposal, as the research assistants are to be eventually recruited following due process as per AUD norms.

4. To discuss about a CCK proposal for financial support from the AUD to organise an exhibition related to NEF Research outcomes.

While discussing the proposal, it was pointed out that ACRPM is not mandated to support School/s/Centres for organizing such exhibition. Hence referred back the proposal to the CCK and requested to process through appropriate channels other than ACRPM.

5. Soliciting ACRPM's views on the project titled "Early Literacy Initiative" with TISS (Proposed by CECED)
The ACRPM favourably considered the proposal and recommended to go ahead for signing the MoU through the Registrar. The project will be supported by the Tata Trusts.

6. To discuss the revised budget for the project titled "Poetry in the Indo-Islamic Millennium: From Manuscript to Teaching Tools" submitted by Dr. Shad Naved, Principal Investigator, Dr. Mrityunjay Tripathi (Co-Principal Investigator-1) and Dr. Awadhesh Tripathi (Co-Principal Investigator-1) for financial support from AUD.

The ACRPM considered the revised proposal and recommended for further approval.

7. To discuss the revised budget for the project titled entitled "Spatio-temporal dynamics of channel bars and islands in River Yamuna – A study using remote sensing and GIS in Delhi stretch" which was submitted by Dr. Pulak Das, School of Human Ecology.

While discussing the revised submitted budget for the proposal, the ACRPM pointed out the following:



- i. The role of field assistant is not clear, when already Research Assistant has been earmarked for 18 months @ Rs.25000 per month.
- ii. Cost of Computer, laptops etc. cannot be included in project proposal and budget line items, as it is a GIA funded project.
- iii. The exact software to be procured and the justification for the procurement of the software needs to be given (This software will eventually form part of the asset of the university).
- iv. Contingency of Rs. 1 lakh needs to be broken up into sub-headings.

In view of the above, the proposal was referred back to the Principle Investigator for revision.

8. **To consider and discuss a request submitted by Dr. Santosh Singh regarding extension of his research project titled the "Ravidassia Movement in Punjab: A sociological Study" till June 2018**

The ACRPM considered the request on the given circumstances and recommended for extension up to March 31, 2018 (in lieu of June 2018).

9. **To discuss for the further follow up action on Seed Money Grant (SMG)**

On the matter, it was recommended that information to be disseminated from Dean (AS) with a follow up intimation from Chair ACRPM. A three member committee including Rukmini Sen, Yogesh Snehi and Babu P. Remesh was constituted to facilitate the implementation of the scheme, with the help of ACRPM secretariat, in a time bound manner.

10. **To consider and discuss a request submitted by Dr. Nandini Nayak regarding to use the available money under other budget heads for photocopy and miscellaneous purpose (Project was sanctioned under GIA Fund)**

After detailed discussion, request submitted by Dr. Nandini Nayak was considered and permitted to use available funds in other heads for meeting the expenses of photocopy. But, in future, such re-appropriation of funds across line items is not allowed.

Regarding selection of research staff, the recruitment needs to be done by following existing AUD norms.

11. **To discuss a research proposal received from the School of Development Studies titled "Researching Delhi – Mapping Industrial Production, Work, Livelihoods and Capabilities in Delhi"**

The ACRPM took note on the recommendations of the Review Committee and recommended that the proposal be considered for further approval and support by the



university. The project was approved with Prof. Sumangala Damodaran and Dr. A. Sengupta as Principal Investigators. The project will be jointly done by all the ex faculty members of SDS.

12. To take further action on the BOM resolution No. 10.2 approved on 03.11.2000 related to expert panel for the selection committee.

It was recommended that information will be sought by from all Schools/Centres for preparing a consolidated panel. (who will seek the information)

13. Proposal to hire a Research Assistant OR Student under "Earn While You Learn Scheme" to assist ACRPM Secretariat

It was recommended that ACRPM can either hire Research Assistant or engage Ph D scholars (under earn while you learn scheme). For the purpose total budget of Rs. 1.5 lakh for 6 months may be sought from the University.

of Lesser Known Narratives from Delhi

Proposal for Seminar, Exhibition and cultural evening

Date - 22nd- 23rd September 2016 (tentative)

Venue - Ambedkar University Delhi and additional venues

OBJECTIVE

As a city whose modernity is built by generations of migrants, this proposed festival will showcase the multi layered diversity of Delhi through stories, images and music that describe how the city spaces are shared and experienced, both in the past and present.

CONCEPT

A growing interest in urban history, of how cities come into being and grow, is moving attention away from documents, books and official files to untapped sources of urban narratives. This allows the documentation and dissemination of the human diversity of the city, by presenting to the city public the cultural and artistic heritage of the various communities living here, and the role played by different ethnic communities, both long time resident and immigrant, in giving the city of Dilli its special flavour and colour.

Today, most people living in various parts of Delhi seldom mix with or relate to their fellow citizens from other parts of the city. For example, people residing within the walled city of Shahjahanabad know very little of happenings in Janakpuri. Likewise, people from Lutyen's New Delhi are unaware of the lives across Yamuna in Shahdara, and the lifestyle around 'urban villages' whether Shahpur Jat or Shadipur are different from the peripheral villages along the approaches to Delhi.

OVERVIEW

The Dara Shikoh festival will draw public attention to the lesser known or forgotten aspects of this diversity that makes up Delhi today. It will be remembered through images, texts and music/songs that carry within them aspects of the city's past. For example, in music, the festival will look at a range from folk to semi classical/classical and even in wedding songs. Similarly, images of the people in the city will cover personal photos to tourist, calendar and religious art, documents and artefacts from personal collections.

The positive response of the Delhi government archaeology department to the previous years (2015-16) Dara Shikoh festival, including attending the events, led to a request by to involve them in the festival. It is hoped that the Dara Shikoh festival will over the years, partner with such agencies of the Delhi government in different ways. The long term objective of hosting of this would be to use the historical legacy of the Dara Shikoh building to house, at first temporarily, and later as a permanent collection, images and objects that will describe everyday lives in Delhi over the years.

In connection with this, the festival will include a scholarly consultation on ways of documenting, preserving and sharing the diversity of intangible memories and tangible records that make up the memories of the city of Delhi.

Activities:

1. *Lived Memories of Delhi- A Visual History (19th and 20th centuries)*

- An exhibition of personal photographs, popular prints, letters, paintings, artifacts (documents etc.) including artefacts from the Changezi Collection from Pahari Imli, Choori walan, near Jama Masjid in the old city. Based on the collections available, the exhibition will arrange these in ways, thematic, or otherwise, that increase viewer interest into knowing about the histories and narratives beyond the photographs.
- The Exhibition will have a curatorial talk about the sources, memories and perceptions of the city. For example, a theme of tents in the city for example as a site of resilience or temporariness (in a flood relief or refugee camp), of adventure or vulnerability (in a boy scout camp or construction workers), or power and grandeur (the 1911 durbar and other military encampments), etc .
- A print catalogue of the exhibition will be released.
- Exhibition will begin at AUD and will be moved to at least another public location like IIC/ IGNSA / Dilli Haat for a wider public showing in other parts of the city.
- Presentation by panel of scholars and professionals familiar with city life, like Patricia Uberoi, Ram Rahman, Yousuf Saeed, etc.

2. *Cultural Evening-* Remembering Delhi through Music of the city and its neighbouring regions. It will include lecture demonstrations by musical troupes, from semi-classical to folk, as well as some music that was once everyday but is now mostly forgotten. Two musical groups from among the list below are to be invited.

- Folk Singers from a village near Meerut with memories of 1857 in Delhi captured in song.
- Folk singers from Punjab with songs and folk lore with references about Delhi.
- Ustad Iqbal Ahmed Khan – oldest living exponent of the Delhi Gharana.
- Shubha Mudgal – memories of domestic life from the wedding songs from Delhi and western UP

The cultural evening will include AUD faculty and students song and musical performances.

3. *Consultation on Delhi Urban Heritage and need for a Museum of Peoples' memory of Delhi.*

As mentioned in the overview, there is a need in the city for a permanent site to host a the memories and recollections of everyday life of residents in the city. This day long consultative meeting will be conducted with both AUD and external scholars and heritage professionals who are interested in highlighting the diversity of lives and peoples lived experiences in the city.

It can also be seen as a preliminary meeting for the proposed international round table and seminar at Delhi in December 2016, being co-organised by AUD(CCK), JNU(IAS) and IIAS, Leiden University.

CCK will share its collections of images, oral narratives and documents with the members of the consultative meeting, so as to develop the themes and issues to be taken up later in December. In addition, the group will also contribute to develop a methodology by which people's memories, experiences and histories can be included in building narratives of the city that can be shown in a Delhi City Museum.

The meeting involve scholars of – (a) History of Delhi, like Narayani Gupta, Sunil Kumar, Henri Fanthome, etc, and (b) urban heritage professional from Hyderabad, Kolkata, etc.

Approximately 12-15 people, scholars, heritage professionals and museum curators will be invited.

This project will document oral narratives from different locations along the river as it flows through Delhi, and cover the diverse nature of socio-economic sites and circumstances that shape the experience of the river.

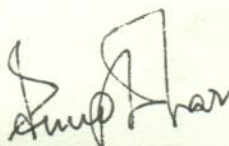
The aim is to derive an account of *Jamuna* as a “living ecosystem”, produced by a confluence of collective and personal associations, local experiences and knowledge systems to arrive at a larger meta-narrative of the river as socio-ecological system with a life of its own.


The project will have a number of outcomes in multiple media – ranging from AV film, to on-site physical exhibitions using text and photographs, an illustrated publication, as well as online platforms like project website and social media presence.

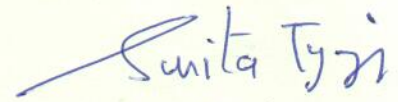

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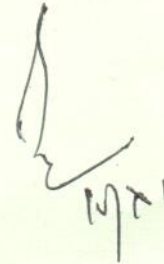

Faculty Research Project - Social and Cultural Archives

Digitising and cataloguing of text, photo, artefacts and multimedia.

Duration of Project – 6 months

Developing content for the AUD Digital Repository, in the form of various kinds of archives, viz. community knowledge, social history and literary, ethnographic and institutional memory is an important part of CCK themes and activities. CCK is in discussion with donors of rare and historical community based ethnographic material in the form of photographs, multimedia and textual material from the following privately held sources. Besides adding to the body of knowledge and information available in public sphere, the above four archives are of sufficient scholarly and public interest to draw attention and web traffic to the AUD website.

The current project involves work on digitising and cataloguing two rare and historical collections.

1. Digitising of Amrit Lal Nagar Archive - personal records, field notes and ephemera –

In addition to being a prolific writer, Amritlal Nagar was a versatile scholar. Unpublished research notes and papers, photographs and audio visual recordings of this eminent Hindi writer of the mid 20th century. The digitisation and creating of public access to the Amritlal Nagar Archive will add enormously to the public knowledge of the social and literary life in Northern India during the mid five decades of the twentieth century, (approximately 1930 to 1980).

Today Amritlal Nagar's Research Library consists of approximately 3500 magazines dating back from 1902 and a collection of over 20,000 books—many of which are rare and out of print. Funds are sought for the general maintenance and preservation of the current holdings of Amritlal Nagar reference Library and for undertaking an extensive digitization project of rare and irreplaceable materials in Amritlal Nagar Archives. The digital archives of Amritlal Nagar's manuscripts, photographs, field and research notes, and audio recordings will be hosted by Ambedkar University Delhi.

In the light of Amritlal Nagar centenary celebration coming up in the year 1915-16, we would like to begin by creating a digital archives of the manuscripts, correspondence with other writers, photographs, field and research notes, and audio recordings. Our objective is to have the Amritlal Nagar archives be available to the students, scholars and researchers throughout the world by August 2015.

The Amritlal Nagar family will oversee the digitisation of the collection based in Lucknow, supervised by Dr Deeksha Nagar, currently in the USA. Upon sanction of the project, she has agreed to pay for her international air ticket and stay in Lucknow till the digitisation is completed.

2. The Naseem Mirza Changezi collection

The Changhezi father son duo in Pahari Imli, Jama Masjid, Delhi have an extraordinary collection of rare manuscripts, Urdu, Arabic and Persian calligraphy samples from across the world, early prints of biographies like the Tuzuk-i-Jahangiri besides several artefacts. Many of the artefacts such as semi precious stone encrusted daggers and inlaid crockery were brought by the family's ancestors when they came to India from Iran. The family ruled a small principality in northern India before they were

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defeated by Akbar and subsequently engaged in his army. The moved to Delhi with ShahJahan and their personal collection boasts of boasts of some extraordinary objects. They are presently preserved with the Changhezis in a small room dedicated to these objects in cellophane laminations and paper wraps.

The cataloguing and digitising to create a digital online catalogue of the entire collection involves interviewing the collectors, listing and accessing the collection, and determining provenance of the objects in the collection.

It is proposed that AUD undertake the cataloguing and itemising of these objects in agreement with the Hazrat Shah Waliullah Library (which they run) and the Changhezi family.

Work Plan: (to begin from January 2015)

1. Hire of Project Assistant (Archiving)
2. Identification and cataloguing of the Changezi collection – objects, images and texts.
3. Initiate the digitising process in Lucknow by initiating instalment of the outsourcing costs.
4. Preparing a publication on the two collections, which include context and narratives.
5. Making visible the catalogue and highlights in an online archive.

Sub: Proposal to create a Social Science & Humanities Research Archive (SSHRA) of literary, social and historical documents.

CCK and SLS would like to partner in creating a Social Science and Humanities Research Archive (SSHRA) to facilitate sharing of historical field data and primary research collected by researchers across disciplines, both external and from within AUD, who wish other researchers to access this material.

CCK has been approached by a number of eminent literary and scholarly persons or their heirs and successors, to digitise and digitally archive their writings, notes, photographs and audio visual recordings, and make these publicly accessible. Such a collection of historical research data from the early decades of the twentieth century if made available easily to social science researchers, will add enormously to the public knowledge of social, economic and literary life of those times.

The archive and its collections would cover a range of subjects, and serve as a 'special collections' library. Accessed and catalogued data would be made searchable using an online catalogue which may be part of the AUD library system. As a professionally managed digital repository SSRA would serve researchers in humanities and social sciences belonging to three constituencies: AUD faculty members and research staff, research (viz. MPhil and PhD) scholars of the University, and researchers at large accessing the collection online.

SSHRA would raise funds for its digitisation and archiving projects on a case by case basis from within and outside AUD. While most collections will be sourced and funded externally, projects proposed by AUD faculty will also be considered for internal (AUD research project) funding.

Cartographic Dimensions of narratives from Indian Literatures

There is a proposal to conduct a seminar on "Interrogating Manuscripts- cartographic dimensions of narratives from Indian literatures" on March 24 and 25, 2015 at Ambedkar University Delhi. This is an outcome of the cartography seminar and exhibition, organized by Centre for Community Knowledge, Ambedkar University Delhi, held between Feb-April 2014 has increased in the involvement of School of Liberal Studies faculty and students in the area of alternative cartographies.

Since then, the AUD faculty and students have been introduced to Delhi comparators group as well as the comparative literature department of Delhi University, being mentored by Prof. T.S.Satyanath. After discussions with Dr.Diamond (School of Liberal studies, Ambedkar University Delhi), Surajit Sarkar (Centre for Community Knowledge, Ambedkar University Delhi) and Dr. Satyanath (Modern Indian Languages, Delhi University), it was felt that a follow up conference on alternative cartographies that emerge from readings of text and oral narratives from different parts of India could be an appropriate subject for this.

It is therefore recommended that a related seminar titled "Interrogating Manuscripts- cartographic dimensions of narratives from Indian literatures" be organized in Ambedkar University Delhi to take this further. Approximately 22 faculty and students from AUD and DU have showed interest in presenting papers for the conference. The English and Hindi faculty at AUD feel that the seminar will go a long way to establish a Masters course in comparative literature in School of Liberal Studies, Ambedkar University Delhi.

Proposal for *Extension - Cameras of the Past (Delhi Visual Archive)*

The Centre for Community Knowledge has since October 2015, been working towards building a Photographic Collection and an Archive of Delhi from 1880 to 1980. The attempt of this project has been to depict visually the everyday life and experience of the people of the city of Delhi. The process of collection, digitisation, annotation and dissemination of these photographs has been one of the key activities of the project.

In this period, the project has managed to collect approximately 4500 photographs of Delhi from personal holdings of various amateur photographers and family collections. A detailed report on the **current status** of the project is attached (See **Flag A**). The collection is expanding with more contributors being identified who are willing to share their rare collection of images, maps and sketches.


CCK's Advisory Committee in its sixth meeting on 22 May 2017 also recommended that the project be carried forward so that its collection is made ready for becoming public. **Recommendations and minutes** of the advisory meeting are attached (See **Flag B**).

Further, India Foundation of Arts (IFA) Bangalore, has entered into **an agreement with CCK** to support two archival fellowships, as part of a grant of Rs. 6 lacs (See **Flag C**). This will help in designing and curating an online gallery and a travelling exhibition. In return, CCK will provide support for project coordination, complete digitisation and metadata acquisition, and give access to the digitised collection.

In light of the above, it is requested that an extension of Cameras of the Past (Delhi Visual Archive) be approved, along with the current Research Assistant, in the interests of continuity. This will enable the collection to become available publicly in the form of an online gallery of photographs, and a travelling exhibition with shows in two cities. **Detailed activities** of this project is attached (See **Flag D**). Budget is shown below.

This Agreement is executed on this day the 5th of June, 2017, between Prof Sanjay Sharma, Director, Centre for Community Knowledge (CCK), Ambedkar University Delhi, Lothian Road, Kashmere Gate, Delhi – 110 006 and Ms Arundhati Ghosh, Executive Director, India Foundation for the Arts (IFA), 'Aparva' Ground Floor, No. 259, 4th Cross, RMV 2nd Stage, Bangalore – 560 094, Karnataka. This Agreement formalizes the collaboration between CCK, Ambedkar University Delhi (AUD) and IFA to implement the scheme of Archival & Museum Fellowships. This Agreement will be in effect from June 5, 2017 to November 30, 2018, on the following terms:

IFA shall be responsible for:

1. Circulating a call for applications across its networks by July 1, 2017;
2. Short-listing candidates and sending short-listed applications to AUD and making final selections in consultation with representatives of AUD;

2. Assist with arranging suitable accommodation for the fellow in Delhi if necessary;
3. Provide conceptual and organizational support to the Fellow;
4. Share details of the project in symposia, grantee presentations, or any other public events IFA may organize around the country;
5. IFA using the Fellow's process materials collected during the course of the IFA-AUD project for presentations at symposia and for other non-commercial purposes;
6. The Fellow presenting the outcome of this collaborative project at mutually agreed spaces (between IFA & the Fellow) where the Fellow will acknowledge IFA, AUD and Sir Ratan Tata Trust (SRTT) support;
7. The costs of putting together the final outcome will be borne by AUD. IFA will also contribute a maximum amount of Rs 2,00,000/- across all the Fellowships made towards the final outcome;
8. Confirm that the travelling exhibition will be presented in a minimum of two cities in India; and
9. Make some time available from the Director at his/her convenience for media interviews.

PARTNERSHIPS

All communication and outcomes will carry partnership branding of India Foundation for the Arts; Centre for Community Knowledge, Ambedkar University Delhi; and the Sir Ratan Tata Trust.

The financial commitment of IFA may be underwritten by a donor (individual, corporate or organisation), in addition to the above, in which case all communication and the final outcome will carry an appropriate acknowledgement of the donor (which will be intimated to you).

MODIFICATIONS

The terms of this Agreement shall be amended, extended or cancelled only by mutual agreement in writing within six months of its commencement.
